
18 The Green Man c. 0001800 CE

This is an image of an electric sheep kept as a pet by humans. After World War Terminus (WWT), many animals became extinct. As a result, owning a scarce animal became a symbol of wealth. To satisfy demand for animal pets from those humans with strong vanity, electronic animals were manufactured to look real. These were less expensive and easier to take care of. The repair on the animal's leg, shows the value of the animal to the human owner, rather than discarding a broken animal, it is cared for. MB 7395.16

An ansible is a superluminal communication device. A time travelling consignment of ten exhibits was sent from the Illegal Museum of Beyond to the exhibition in 1981. 21 Prosthetic communication device c. 0002300-0002400 CE South East England



This archaeological object, recovered from ancient human burial tombs, is the remains of bioprosthetic extensions of the human body. Bioprosthetic devices eliminated the need for separate technological devices, such as mobile phones. This meant that there was no longer a risk of forgetting your phone, or having it stolen.
